DEBUT OF WELCOME PACKETS

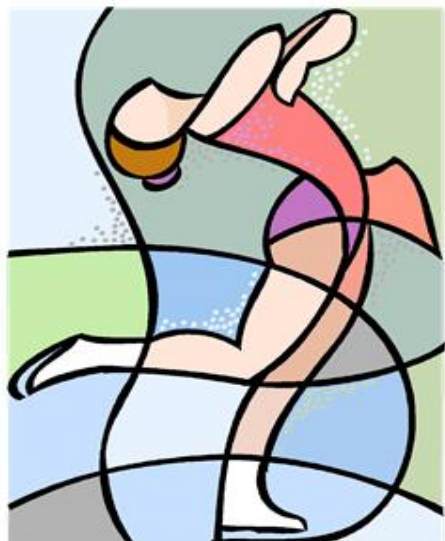

Last year, 26 skaters competed in Team Compulsory events for SQSA Parade, culminating in our performances at ISI World's in Blaine that helped us secure the 4th place finish.

This year, our program has grown to 28 skaters with five small Ensemble teams, which will combine into two large Production teams. They will compete at Blades of March and other competitions(s) and perform at Winter Exhibition and Spring Ice Show.

Ensemble and Production teams allow greater flexibility for number of skaters per team, moves, choreography and multiple skill levels. There are no restrictions on testing and no required moves. Numbers will focus on creative choreography and great skating, strengths of SQSA Parade skaters.

SKATERS COMPETE AT NATIONAL SHOWCASE IN OHIO

Three club skaters, Alana Christie, Jillian Christie and Julia Hussian competed at the U.S. Figure Skating sponsored, National Showcase competition in Ohio this August. They qualified for the national event by placing in the top three in a regional event held in Rochester.

National Showcase fuses artistic creativity with figure skating. USFS bills it as “a competition in theatrical skating.”

Amber Van Wyk who choreographs many of the club group numbers and programs for some skaters coached the skaters. Amber is a former “Disney on Ice” skater and her creativity in choreography is well known.

The ladies were entered in several events and did very well. Julia earned a Pewter medal, Alana earned a Silver, Bronze and two Pewter medals and Jillian, two Golds, a Silver and two Pewters. Jillian was also honored by being invited to be a Parade of Champions performer.
